
Anxiety is more common than we think and its long-term impact is immense if it remains unmanaged.

The students at Holy Spirit are learning about our symbolic Creation Story. Here is a child friendly version of Genesis 1 for you to read with your child, discuss and wonder.

#### In the Beginning...

there was no earth or sky or sea or animals. And then God spoke in the darkness: "Let there be light!" And right away there was light. "That's good!" said God. "From now on, when it's dark it will be 'night' and when it's light, it will be 'day'." The evening came and the night passed and then the light returned. That was the first day.

On the second day, God made the earth and over it He carefully hung a vast blue sky. He stood back and admired His creation. "That's good too!" said God and the second day was

over.

The next morning God looked around and thought, "The earth needs to be a bit more organized." So, He put all the water in one place and all the dry land in another. When He had finished that, God made plants to cover the land. Dandelions and daffodils appeared. All sorts of trees and grasses began to grow. "It's looking great," said God and that was the end of the third day.

On the fourth day, God looked around and thought, "The daylight still needs a bit more work and the night is just too dark." So, He made the sun to light the sky during the day and the moon and stars to add a bit of sparkle to the night. He hung them in the sky and stepped

back to look at his work. "This is coming along very well," said God.

The next day, God turned his attention to the water he had collected in the oceans. "I want these waters teeming with life!" As soon as He said it, it was so. In no time, there were millions of small fish darting through the shallow water and huge fish swimming in the ocean. God made birds, too. He sent them soaring through the air. After six days, the whole universe was completed. On the seventh day God had a nice long

rest and enjoyed looking at all He had made.

#### PARENT ENGAGEMENT

The Parent Engagement Action Team will work through this data and report back to you on actions that are taken in response, but for now we wanted to give you a brief snapshot of some themes that emerged from these responses.

Importantly, there were many areas where responses were overwhelmingly positive. One such area was with respect to the school culture, almost all respondents providing responses to the effect that the culture is respectful, welcoming and accessible. In addition, there was significant recognition that our school has a large number of dedicated and nurturing teachers.

What the Parent Engagement Action Team were particularly interested in – was opportunities for improvement and this data did reveal two key themes.

The inviting and actioning of parent feedback appeared an area where some respondents felt we could be doing better. Further consideration is going to be given by the team on how feedback practices could be improved – part of this might be putting in place better strategies to communicate how feedback is treated and the impact it is having.

Opportunities for parent education about some aspects of the school. The data indicates there are parents who consider they don't adequately understand aspects of the school that they are interested in understanding, such as school decision-making processes and approaches to classroom learning.

Parent Engagement in teaching and learning is an important area of focus – improvement in this area is likely to lead to improved outcomes for our children. The Parent Engagement Team will continue to update you on initiatives in this area and we will seek further input from our school community in due course.




