

Meet Jane Coghlan of grade 3/4 JJ. Jane shares her class with Julie. Jane says:





COMMITTEE NEWS

FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD

Melinda Buscema, our Deputy Principal & Learning Diversity and Wellbeing Leader, gave a very informative presentation on the more recent NCCD funding model. This is a nationally consistent model across all schools, to apply for, and gain funding to support students with identified learning challenges. Challenges can be across one or more areas of Cognitive, Sensory, Physical, and Social/Emotional development. Funding is accessible to a much more diverse range of students, and is school driven.

Students with additional learning needs/challenges are identified, and 10 weeks worth of data is collected to provide evidence to support their application.

One seventh of our school's income is from NCCD funding!! The resources this funding allows for is diverse. Examples are that the school has been able to provide more LSO's (Learning Support Officers) in classrooms, and provide other initiatives such as the Social Skills program, to cater for specific identified needs, and build the capacity of our staff. Thank you Melinda, and all the staff for their huge efforts.

It was lovely to meet our assistant Priest Fr. Alex at our last meeting. We welcomed him to our community. Ben Lannen, updated us on the Digital reporting system that will continue to be utilised, with the option for parents to print a copy based on feedback received. There has been a new school wide positive behavior team formed, and a new pathway will be implemented to continue to strengthen positive behaviors at our school. Duncan reported that Foundation 2020 offers have gone out. If anyone knows of a family considering Holy Spirit, please encourage them to apply, as enrolments are still open. An initiative underway to build the capacity of staff is a number of our LSO's completing an upgrade to Cert IV. We wish them every success. The school master plan committee is well underway, and the construction of a "sensory garden" will commence shortly.

Thank you to those that contribute in all ways to making Holy Spirit the best it can be!

PARENT ENGAGEMENT ACTION TEAM

In light of the School Improvement Plan, a Parent Engagement Action Team has been formed at Holy Spirit. The team consists of seven parents, and is led by Duncan Arendse (Principal) and Kylie Papadopoulos (School Advisory Board Chairperson). The goal of the Parent Engagement Action Team is to work alongside staff to build upon and strengthen authentic partnerships with parents and the broader community in the holistic education of all children at Holy Spirit.

The team met for the first time this week. The team explored the notion of 'Parent Involvement' versus 'Parent Engagement'. There is now a common understanding amongst members of the team that 'Parent Engagement' is when parent involvement is linked explicitly to student learning. It is where conversations are two way, or three way between teachers, students and parents. 'Parent Engagement' is when opportunities exist to connect learning in school, at home, and the wider community. It is also about authentic strategies to build partnerships and to share knowledge.

Duncan and Kylie shared the process the team will work through. This will involve gathering data, developing an action plan to implement strategies based on current best practices of how to partner with parents, and then finally review and reflect. The time frame for the process will be approximately twelve months.

During the meeting the team actioned the first part of the process - gathering data. In consultation with a Catholic Education Melbourne survey tool, a survey will be electronically sent to parents in the near future. The data generated from the survey will be collated and analysed to give the team a starting point of what specific strategies to implement. The team thanks the parent body in advance for their support of completing the survey.

The Parent Engagement Action Team will meet again next month. We look forward to continuing to share the journey with you, as we build the capacity of engaging parents in their children's learning.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes: year of schooling

category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional

level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools

develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. NCCD Information Sheet for Parents, Carers and Guardians

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) On School Students with Disability

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data?

Schools must now complete the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) every year. It counts the number of students who receive additional adjustments or "help" at school because of a disability. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability.

Who is counted in the data collection?

To count a student in the NCCD, schools must think through some key questions:

- Is the student getting help at school so that they can take part in education on the same basis as other students?
- Is the help given because of a disability? The word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability</u> <u>Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA) and it can include many students.
- 3. Has the school talked to you or your child about the help that they provide?
- 4. Has the school kept records about the help they provide, the student needs and the reasons that the student needs this help? The school will need to keep copies of tests, student work, assessments, records of meetings, medical reports or other paperwork and information about how the student's learning is moving along over time.

Once the school decides that the student should be counted in the NCCD, they then choose a disability group and one of four levels of help that has been given to the student.

What does the word 'disability' mean in the NCCD?

In the NCCD the word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA). There are four types of disability that the school can choose from: sensory, cognitive, social-emotional and physical.

Many students that need help at school can be counted in the NCCD. For example, students with learning problems, e.g. specific learning disability or reading difficulty (sometimes called dyslexia), health problems (e.g. epilepsy or diabetes), physical disability (e.g. cerebral palsy), vision/hearing loss and social-emotional problems (e.g. selective mutism, Autism Spectrum Disorder, anxiety).

Letters from doctors or specialists can be very helpful for schools as they plan how to support students with their learning. Schools do not need to have these letters before they can count a

student in NCCD. Teachers can use all that they know about the student's learning and the records that they have collected over time to decide if a student can be counted in the NCCD.

What sort of help does the school give students?

Students need different types of help at school. Some students need a little help sometimes while other students need a lot of help nearly all the time. The type of help given depends on the needs of the student. The help can include changes to the school buildings or grounds (e.g. ramps or things like special desks or chairs), extra teacher help in classes, special learning programs, changes to the work they give the student or extra adult help.

How will the NCCD be different this year?

All schools have been counting students in the NCCD since 2015. The government will use the NCCD data as part of the funding to schools.

What will the school need to know about my child for the NCCD?

Schools work together with families to understand the needs of each child. It is helpful if families give their child's teacher a copy of any letters or reports they have. The letters or reports will help the school understand the child and the help that they might need. Letters from doctors, psychologists, speech pathologists, doctor, and occupational therapists etc. can be very helpful for schools. These reports along with information that the teacher has (i.e. school based tests, your child's work and learning plans) helps the school to understand and meet your child's needs.

What happens to the NCCD data? Who will have the NCCD information?

Each school principal must check the NCCD data in August of each year. The school will give the information to the Catholic Education Office. The school will work with the Catholic Education Office to make sure that the NCCD data is OK before they give the data to the government. The government will not be given the names of any students or any letters or records. Please ask your school for their privacy policy if you need to know more.

Does the school need me to agree with them about counting my child in the NCCD?

Amendments were made to the <u>Australian Education Act 2013</u> and <u>Australian Education Regulation</u> <u>2013</u>). Schools do not need you to agree to let them count a child in the NCCD. You cannot ask the school not to count your child.

Where can I find out more?

Please contact your child's school if you have further questions about the NCCD and/or refer to the national NCCD Portal.
