Pray For Roman



Late last year Roman DeAngelis, aged 8, was diagnosed with a very rare type of brain tumour. He requires daily treatment at the Royal Children's Hospital. Roman is a Year 3 student at St Patrick's, Lilydale. His mother, Linda DeAngelis, works at Holy Spirit Community School Ringwood North. She worked with prep students in 2019 as a Learning Support Officer. Due to the severity of Roman's illness and the daily treatment required she is unable to work. We are raising funds to support Roman and Linda. Roman is currently being transported by Linda from Lilydale to the hospital, on a daily basis for treatment. This financial support will assist with medical expenses, supporting his grandparents who live overseas, to assist be relocating to Melbourne in the short to medium term as well as for travel expenses. We are aiming to raise \$15000 by the end of the year. Financial assistance is required urgently as treatment has begun. We are urging both school communities to get behind this cause firstly by donating to this campaign as well as spreading this appeal as far and wide as possible. Given the specialised nature of firstly Roman's condition as well as his treatment, financial assistance is the preferred method of help at this time.

News from The Board

The new School Board met for the first time on 17 February 2020. We received a great presentation from Duncan Arendse (Principal) and Lauren Witnish (Deputy Principal) about Holy Spirit's NAPLAN results and the outcome of the Catholic Education Melbourne School Improvement Survey (CEMSIS) data. Overall it is pleasing note the positive trend in NAPLAN data which reports performance at Years 3 and 5 against state and national averages for literacy and numeracy. The CEMSIS data provides three levels of analysis - Student, Family and Staff responses. The data is being used by staff to develop comprehensive action plans. The data will continue to form the foundation of evidence to guide Holy Spirit's improvement plans.

School Board members 2020

The School Board will meets twice per term. This is an opportunity to meet with the Principal and staff around the progress being made at Holy Spirit.



Winter Shelter

The School Board discussed the plans for the Winter Shelter program being run by the parish and noted the success of the 2019 program. Whilst it is noted that some families have expressed concerns, the a school Board noted the various policies and controls in place and indicated its support for the program to be conveyed to the parish.
