Dear parents, friends and Father Arsenio

I am so pleased to begin this newsletter with a welcome to Father Arsenio. He officially took up his position on April I<sup>st</sup> and it is so strange that I can't introduce him to you all in person. On behalf of all in our community I want to wish him all the best as our parish priest.

As for the circumstances that we find ourselves in now, I am sure I echo your thoughts when I say it cannot end soon enough. I want to congratulate our staff for the work that went on behind the scenes in ensuring that learning from home started so well last week.

I cannot thank you, our parents enough either. Firstly, for the way you have assisted the learning from home for our students. Our staff will lead the teaching and learning however it does require supervision at home. Secondly, despite the school being open I have managed to keep the teachers at home working on the teaching and learning. This too could not have worked without your help. I do not expect parents to be teachers at home. And cannot stress enough the importance of checking in with your child's teacher for any assistance required.

The feedback from staff, parent and students has also been helpful in adjusting what we are doing. I have also appreciated feedback from Danie McNeil and Matt Porter which resulted in my first video to the community. I apologise for the informality of it, however given the circumstances I think it was ok.

There are a number of supervision issues we need to ensure are addressed when working remotely with students. This is the only reason that any video conferencing has not begun. On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April Ben will assist by doing a second roll out of devices to families. This will put us close to 100 devices having been sent home for families to use. I am so grateful that our school has the resources to call upon to do this. The fine work of the P&F in past times has well and truly paid off.

It has been wonderful to see that many Wellbeing platforms have been added to our online learning as well with exercises, and artistic areas for our students.




