# Changes to Covid Guidelines

Dear Families,

Today we received the latest update around guidelines from Catholic Education Melbourne. Life is slowly starting to return to 'normal' in our schools.

Important information for families

- Hand hygiene and twice daily cleaning of the school will continue
- Parents are still not permitted to congregate before or after school and should be maintaining social distancing, if you are unable to do this then a mask must be worn
- There are still limits in place in regard to public gatherings both indoors and outdoors in line with government regulations (20 people indoors and 50 people outdoors)
- School taps will now be available for the children to use, we would encourage the continued use of drink bottles where possible
- The staggered finish to the end of the school day will finish and all students will be dismissed at 3:30 and 3:15 on a Monday from the beginning of next week
- If entering the school (administration area only) at any time, face masks must continue to be worn. Teachers are required to continue to wear face masks except when in the act of teaching
- There will no longer be strict guidelines in place for the children to limit mixing between grades when indoors

In line with CEM recommendations the school shall continue to limit parent access to the school as we continue with the established good practices that have been in place for the preceding months.

When we return to school at the end of January 2021 we look forward to welcoming parents and friends back onto the school site. There may still be protocols in place in regard to tracing but we will communicate these at a later time.

Our Year 6 children were lucky enough to attend Camp this week at Merricks Lodge. For the majority of students in Victoria this has not been possible. It is thanks to the determination of our Senior Level Leader Caeleigh that she was able to source a camp able to take the booking, visit the camp prior to the children attending and organise all that attending camp involves to make this happen for the children. By all stories that have come back to school it has been a wonderful experience for all. No doubt there will be some weary children and teachers on their return this afternoon. I am sure you will join with me in thanking the teachers and acknowledging their commitment to the children by being away from their own families and on duty 24 hours a day for four days. Thank you!

We have also been fortunate in being able to organise a combined Confirmation and Graduation Mass for the Year 6 students and their parents while still observing guidelines around gathering. There will be four Masses which will allow for a meaningful and special gathering. An unprecedented year but one where everyone has worked very very hard to ensure some kind of normality for the children.



# Metal Straw Sales

Dear families,

It is with great excitement that we announce our Grade 1/2 Metal Straw sale has raised \$323 for the Australian Marine Conservation society.

Over the course of Term Three our students in Grade 1/2 interpreted the human impact of plastic pollution on the environment and evaluated it in the light of the Catholic understanding of stewardship. They then considered the environmental issue stemming from plastic pollution from another point of view, such as a fisherman or a sea animal.

Students then investigated the key scripture stories of Jesus' forgiveness and compassion and related these to our precious ocean. They were assisted to navigate their own understanding of how they were called into a deeper relationship with others, the world and God and this is where the idea of reducing the use of single use plastic straws and replacing them with reusable metal straws was born.

We decided to raise awareness of the impact using plastic straws had on our oceans and marine life by holding a sale of reusable metal straws. The students were able to demonstrate how they were called into commitment and action to help reduce the

plastic pollution in our oceans. They were also able to vote which charity we donated our profits to, too! We are so incredibly proud of our students for their efforts and commitment to this cause.


